

In 1992, Gavin Newsom founded San Francisco's popular PlumpJack Wines on Fillmore Street on the principle of making wine buying more approachable in a friendly, non-intimidating manner to transform the wine purchasing experience into one of fun and discovery.

Inspired by one of Shakespeare's most memorable characters, Sir John "PlumpJack" Falstaff, PlumpJack celebrates the convivial spirit of its namesake with an inviting and approachable style.

Located in the Stags Leap District AVA, Gold LEED Certified Odette Estate Winery is the third winery to join the portfolio in 2012.



Howell Mountain is located in the Vaca Mountains on the northeast side of Napa Valley. It was the first sub-appellation designated within the Napa Valley AVA in 1983.

CADE Estate Winery is Napa's first LEED Gold-certified winery. Vineyards in the Howell Mountain AVA are planted between 1,400 - 2,200 feet above sea level

The volcanic soil and steep grades create excellent drainage resulting in dense, concentrated fruit character while cloud inversion allows maximum daily sun exposure and increased photosynthesis which develops phenolic ripeness as compared to sugar ripeness.





As the crow flies, about a half mile over the mountain from our modern CADE Estate, lies the seldom told story of an extraordinary winery sitting on top of a special piece of land.

13th Vineyard, a name inspired by its roots as the thirteenth bonded winery in the state of California, dates back to the late 1800s when Jean Brun, a native of Bordeaux, and Jean V. Chaix, were one of the first to plant Medoc grapes on this Howell Mountain Estate. Shortly thereafter, in 1886, the duo built a three-story gravity fed winery made of stone.

This property not only gave us an opportunity to rediscover the past, but it allowed us to grow into the future by expanding our production of CADE Estate driven wines, many of which are made in this historic stone winery.

Say Hello to Danielle Cyrot

Winemaker, CADE Estate Winery

Danielle Cyrot grew up in Orange County, California to a French father and Irish mother. Her childhood was spent summering in France where she was exposed to the winemaking history of her family from a young age. Her great-grandfather was the last in a long line of ancestors who owned the Cyrot vineyard in Burgundy's prestigious Côte de Beaune.

Danielle enrolled at the University of California, Davis with no plans to carry on her family's legacy in winemaking. That quickly changed when she took an introductory winemaking class and realized she had found her calling. At Davis, Danielle worked harvests at both Schramsberg and Artesa in the Napa Valley, where she learned the trade from the soil up. After completing her studies, earning a Bachelor of Science in Viticulture and Enology, Danielle worked abroad at wineries in Alsace, France and South Australia.

After honing her skills overseas, Danielle came back to the Napa Valley and took a job as an enologist at Stags' Leap Winery. Danielle's talents were quickly recognized as she was promoted to assistant winemaker under her mentor, Robert Brittan. During her six-year tenure at Stags' Leap Winery, Danielle learned to trust her palate and create world-class wines that merited her next promotion as winemaker at St. Clement. Danielle spent seven years creating elegant, structured and significant wines that expressed her personality and what she likes in a glass of wine.

Danielle lives with her college sweetheart in Napa balancing work and play as well as their toddler-son, Blake. Danielle joined CADE Estate Winery in August of 2012 where she focuses on crafting wines from her two favorite varietals, Sauvignon Blanc and Cabernet Sauvignon. CADE Estate Winery produces two Sauvignon Blanc offerings (Napa Valley and Oakville Estate) as well as three Cabernet Sauvignon offerings (Napa Valley, Estate Howell Mountain and Reserve Howell Mountain).



CADE ESTATE WINES

VINEYARD NOTES

In 2021, 28% of the fruit came from our Estate vineyard in Oakville and 18% from the CADE 13th Vineyard on Howell Mountain. We also worked with three other properties: Stanley Vineyard (24%), Berggruen in St. Helena (20%), and Juliana Vineyard in Pope Valley (10%). The grapes were harvested from August 6th through September 9th, 2021.

FERMENTATION & AGING

Fermentation was carried out in a combination of stainless-steel tanks and drums (87%) and new French oak barrels (9%). Ten different strains of yeast were used to ferment the juice. Fermentation lasted for an average of 20 days at an average temperature of 56.00 F with no malolactic fermentation occurring. The wine aged in stainless steel tanks and barrels for five months. The barrels and stainless-steel drums were aged sur lies without stirring the lees.

WINEMAKER IMPRESSIONS


Our 2021 Sauvignon Blanc has aromas of guava, green apple, lemon, lime, white peach, lemon grass, green melon, and orange blossom. In the palate are flavors of citrus, banana, Meyer lemon, pineapple, mango, lemon meringue, cantaloupe, and grapefruit. The wine finishes with a bright acidity, a touch of minerality, and a nice creamy mid palate texture.

Sourcing Sauvignon Blanc fruit from all over Napa Valley gives the wine great complexity in aroma and flavor. Fermenting the juice in stainless steel preserves the wonderful, varied fruits of the Sauvignon Blanc grape. The small portion of juice that is fermented in new French oak barrels gives the wine a bit of texture and creaminess which helps balance the natural bright acidity of the grape. The addition of Semillon brings acidity, minerality, and a touch of lemon grass to the wine. The Viognier adds the orange blossom, cantaloupe, and viscosity to the wine.

2018 CADE Estate Cabernet Sauvignon, Howell Mountain

VINEYARD NOTES

The CADE Howell Mountain Cabernet Sauvignon is sourced from five vineyards on Howell Mountain, including the CADE Estate Vineyard, 13th Vineyard, Ink Grade Vineyard, Cold Springs, and Eagle Summit. The bountiful 2018 vintage started on September 26th, with fruit from the Ink Grade Vineyard and finished on November 9th with fruit from 13th Vineyard.

FERMENTATION & AGING

The majority of the fermentations went through a very short maceration time between 4 and 6 days and hot fermentation temperatures, peaking at 92 F. The must was pressed off at between 20 -12 Brix and fermentation was allowed to finish in tank or barrel. The resulting wines have amazing color and big intensity.

ÉLEVAGE

The wine received 19 months barrel aging in 100% French oak from more than 20 Coopers (67% new). Malolactic fermentation occurred in barrel immediately after primary fermentation. The wine was racked quarterly once malolactic fermentation was complete.

WINEMAKER IMPRESSIONS

OUR THOUGHTS

The resulting wine is fantastic with aromas of clove, cranberry, raspberry, coffee, cinnamon, black pepper, and coco nibs. Gloriously pure notes of boysenberry, graphite, blackberry, coffee and dark chocolate soar from the glass and cascade over the palate. The wine is full-bodied, with an opulent, velvety texture, pure, rich with firm tannins and bold structure that is classic Howell Mountain.

2018 CADE Reserve Cabernet Sauvignon, Howell Mountain

VINEYARD NOTES

The CADE Estate is situated on a 54 acre property with 21 acres planted to vines. Located in the heart of Howell Mountain, our CADE Reserve vineyards sit at elevations ranging from 1,500 to 1,850 feet and is planted Cabernet Sauvignon, Malbec, and Petit Verdot. The 2017 vintage also features fruit from our newly acquired 82 acre property on Howell Mountain, 13th Vineyard. Fruit was harvested from September 28th through October 25th.

FERMENTATION & AGING

The fruit was hand picked, destemmed/whole berry, hand sorted, and pumped into small stainless steel fermentation tanks. The must was kept at 50°F for a two day cold soak. Fermentation was hot and fast with temperatures reaching a maximum of 92°F and the juice macerating on the skins/seeds for 5-7 days.

ÉLEVAGE

The wine was aged for 20 months in 100% New French Oak barrels. Only free run wine was used in the blend, no press fractions were selected. Racking occurred immediately after the completion of malolactic fermentation, then on a quarterly basis until bottling.

WINEMAKER IMPRESSIONS

The 2017 Reserve Cabernet Sauvignon has amazing aromas of boysenberry jam, black cherry, milk chocolate, roasted coffee, rose petal, and brown spices. In the palate are flavors of raspberry, cherry cola, dark chocolate, caramel, vanilla, black pepper, and raspberry. The texture of this wine is exceptionally silky for Howell Mountain. The intensity and persistence of this wine in the palate showcases the beauty and structure of our hillside vineyards.





PlumpJack Winery sits squarely in the heart of Napa Valley's renowned Oakville region, surrounded by a 42-acre estate vineyard highly regarded for the quality of its Cabernet Sauvignon.

The east side of our vineyard lies along the foothills of the Vaca mountain range and yields grapes with the kind of bold fruit character that comes from well-draining, aiken, hillside soils.

To the west, our vines take root in loamy clay soils, for grapes with softer, more supple varietal character.






Say Hello to Aaron Miller Winemaker, PlumpJack Estate Winery

As Head Winemaker for PlumpJack Winery, Aaron Miller brings over a decade of wideranging experience and an extensive education to the position, holding a Master of Science in Viticulture and Enology from UC Davis. A California native, he found his calling in the wine industry and planted roots in Napa. Miller is dedicated to crafting Oakville Cabernet that not only showcases the terroir of the estate's 42 acres, but also to crafting Oakville Cabernet Sauvignon in the PlumpJack style.


"My goal is always to make wine that is strong enough to stand on its own, yet elegant enough to be enjoyed with food," says Miller. "The soil profile at PlumpJack allows for such complexity - simultaneously light and dense. That diversity necessitates preparedness. When it comes to winemaking, I think ten steps ahead, and then act. Being well prepared is critical in order to find the balance between the science and the art of winemaking."

2020 PlumpJack Reserve Chardonnay, Napa Valley

VINTAGE

The Napa Valley had very low rainfall heading into the 2020 growing season. Overall, our vines had shorter shoot growth than is typical and our crop was smaller than normal. With a light crop and warmer spring and summer, the Chardonnay harvest got off to an early start. The grapes were quite small and the flavors were very concentrated, and this concentration and depth of flavor was captured in the resulting wine.

FERMENTATION & AGING

Our Reserve Chardonnay was fermented and aged in 64% stainless steel tanks and 36% French oak Burgundy barrels. These fermentations were kept cool – 52 to 55 degrees F – to preserve the fresh fruit aromatics. The use of stainless steel also helps to retain the fresh, varietal character, while the oak adds depth and complexity. We do not allow this wine to undergo malolactic fermentation so that we can preserve the vibrant and lively acid on the palate along with the fresh aromatics.

WINEMAKER IMPRESSIONS

The nose of the 2020 PlumpJack Chardonnay opens with a range of citrus notes - lemon, orange zest, pomelo, and key lime. Just behind these are the rich tropical notes of lychee and feijoa along with the sweeter, more delicate aromatics of white peach and honeysuckle. Underneath all of this is a hint of toasted hazelnuts and spice. The palate has similar flavors and a creamy texture reminiscent of lemon curd. The vibrant and bright acidity balances the creaminess and gives this wine life. This acidity, along with the beautiful structure, delivers an enduring finish.

Ninety percent of our Merlot barrels were French Oak Bordeaux barrels and 10% were American Oak barrels.

WINEMAKER IMPRESSIONS

Our Merlot vineyard is in the Oak Knoll region of the Napa Valley, and is nestled up to the Mayacamas Mountain Range on the west side of the valley. The mild climate and alluvial soils in this region lend this wine great balance and structure. The mild temperatures allow these grapes to develop bright aromatics and flavors, along with a beautiful natural acidity and elegance. The alluvial soils bring darker fruits to the nose and palate, and give this wine its structure and concentration. The 2018 vintage has a beautiful and complex nose – black cherry, boysenberry jam, plum, and fresh cut flowers come through first, then cardamom, nutmeg, and a touch of cocoa and vanilla enter giving the nose depth and intrigue. The palate too has great depth and complexity - flavors of red cherries, muddled berries, and dried herbs, with a creamy texture and silky tannin complimented by a fresh, vibrant acidity.



After pressing, the wine was transferred to French Oak Burgundy barrels where it underwent malolactic fermentation. The wine was kept on heavy lees for several months and was stirred twice a month during this time. The coopers used in this wine include Francois Freres, Meyrieux, and Sirugue, of which, 78% were new barrels. The wine was aged in these barrels for 16 months prior to bottling.

WINEMAKER IMPRESSIONS

Our 2018 Syrah was grown in the cooler Carneros region of the Napa Valley. This cooler climate lends this wine its defining characteristics. The nose is packed with spices and white pepper, plum, blackberry, blueberry, and red cherry, and underneath, there is a suggestion of grilled meats. The flavors on the pallet are plum, berries, spices, and peppercorn with blueberries and cocoa lingering on the finish. The palate is full and rounded with firm tannin and a beautiful acid providing the backbone and length.

After pressing, the wine was transferred to French Oak Burgundy barrels where it underwent malolactic fermentation. The wine was kept on heavy lees for several months and was stirred once each month during this time. The coopers used in this wine include Francois Freres, Meyrieux, and Sirugue, of which, 73% were new barrels. The wine was aged in these barrels for 16 months prior to bottling.

WINEMAKER IMPRESSIONS

This Syrah is truly a wine of place and the character of this wine is dictated by the cooler climate of the Los Carneros growing region. The cooler weather helps the Syrah to fully develop ripe fruit character while retaining freshness and incredible spice. The nose on the 2019 PlumpJack Syrah opens up with a range of fresh berries - blackberry, blueberry, boysenberry, and cranberry. Just behind the fruit is beautiful warming spice - cardamom, cinnamon, and nutmeg - along with black and white peppercorn. There are additional layers of more earthy notes - damp soil, crushed granite, and cured tobacco. The palate is full-bodied, with a round, silky texture that is beautifully framed by firm yet supple tannin. This is a beautiful and complex wine.

The Estate grapes were cold soaked for 3-4 days and then fermented up to a maximum temperature of 94 degrees. The wines were drained off the skins after a total maceration of 7 -12 and racked to barrel to undergo malolactic fermentation and to age. This wine was aged in 100% French oak barrels, 78% of which were new. The coopers used were primarily Sylvain, Taransaud, Cavin, and Nadalie. The cooperage is a blend of medium, medium-plus, and heavy toast barrels from a variety of forests. This blend of coopers, forests, and toasts adds layers and aromatic complexity to the wine.

WINEMAKER IMPRESSIONS

The cooler vintage allows more of the red fruits to shine in the 2018 PlumpJack Estate Cabernet Sauvignon. The nose shows aromas of ripe cherry and raspberry, rose petal, anise, and a touch of blueberry and blackberry underneath. The barrels add layers of vanilla, toffee, nutmeg, cardamom, and cedar. These flavors come through on the palate as well, which is silky upon entry with a mouth-filling mid-palate, and showcases big and bold, yet fine and velvety, tannins throughout. The finish lingers for an eternity and eventually leaves you with the impression of baker's chocolate and espresso.



The wines were then racked to 100% new French oak Sylvain, Darnajou, and Taransaud barrels for malolactic fermentation and where they aged for 22 months prior to bottling.

WINEMAKER IMPRESSIONS

The long growing season in 2018 allowed these grapes to fully develop rich, dark flavors, while the mild temperatures preserved deeply hued color, great structure, and concentration. The nose begins with blackberry, boysenberry, and cassis layered with mocha and dark chocolate. Then some spice and herb come forward - cinnamon, nutmeg, graham cracker, and fresh sage and mint - adding layers, complexity, and depth to the nose. 

Stags Leap District is responsible for producing the winning Cabernet Sauvignon at the 1976 Judgement of Paris Tasting.

























Say Hello to Jeff Owens Winemaker, Odette Estate Winery

A longtime member of the PlumpJack family, Jeff Owens directs the winemaking at our Stags Leap Estate, Odette, with incredible passion and great detail to his craft. A 2005 graduate of Cal Poly: San Luis Obispo, Jeff was part of the first graduating class in Wine & Viticulture at the University.

Spending his first harvest internship at the highly respected Cakebread Cellars here in Napa Valley, Jeff wanted an opportunity to work at a more boutique facility. After a great deal of research, Jeff handpicked a select group of wineries to apply to—one of which was PlumpJack. Hired initially as a cellar worker in early 2006, Jeff quickly rose up through the ranks becoming a vital member of the winemaking team. Promoted to Enologist, followed by Assistant Winemaker for PlumpJack, Jeff gained an intimate knowledge of the property, as well as winemaking as a whole.

In 2010 Jeff was presented an opportunity to move to Howell Mountain as CADE's Assistant Winemaker. After two harvests on Howell Mountain, yet another opportunity for growth presented itself to Jeff with the purchase of a 3rd winery by PlumpJack, this one located in Stags Leap. 



VINEYARD NOTES

In 2018 we continued to work closely with our favorite local growers throughout the broader Napa Valley. The backbone of this blend comes from Ink Grade (on the back side of Howell Mountain), which provides the framework and structure to carry this wine. This site is complemented by Oso Vineyard, which is located in very close proximity, our Estate Vineyard in the Stags Leap District, Blue Tooth Vineyard down the road from Odette in Oak Knoll, and Las Amigas Vineyard in Carneros. All of these sites come together in unison to create a beautiful expression of Cabernet Sauvignon. This diversity and range within the Napa Valley has allowed us to craft a wine which showcases the unique terroir in an approachable, elegant style.

FERMENTATION & AGING

Fermentation took place in small fully jacketed stainless steel fermenters after a 48-hour cold soak at 55 F. The stainless steel fermenters showcase the purity of the fruit while preserving the freshness and allowing the terroir to shine. Maceration lasted 8-14 days at a maximum temperature of 92 F. Malolactic fermentation took place in barrel and finished up in late winter. The wine was aged in 50% new oak and 50% one-fill oak barrels with minimal racking for 18 months before bottling.

WINEMAKER IMPRESSIONS

The 2018 Adaptation Cabernet Sauvignon is opaque purple in color, presenting notes of wild blackberries, luxardo cherries, plums, creme de cassis with hints of fresh spring flowers. This full bodied expression displays beautiful ripeness with elegant, very fine, well integrated tannins and a gorgeous silky texture. Built for near term appreciation and long term potential, this forward, upfront and approachable style can be enjoyed over the next decade+.

Malolactic fermentation took place in barrel and finished up in late winter. The wine was aged in 50% new Burgundian oak barrels and 50% one-fill oak barrels with minimal racking for 18 months before bottling.

The 2018 Petite Sirah exhibits the classic deep, dark, purple hue, unveiling wild blackberries, mulberries, black currants and cr me de casis with hints of violets, Asian spice and black tea. 

VINEYARD NOTES

This wine is crafted from the famed Hudson Ranch off Henry Road in the Carneros AVA of Napa Valley. 2020 is the third year working with both Block 5BS and 6S. These unique blocks bring a combination of different attributes that harmonize beautifully in the final blend. The adjacent blocks are both planted to Odette Estate Winemaker Jeff Owens' favorite selection, "old shot Wente", also referred to as "chicks and hens".

HARVEST

In 2020 Mother Nature brought us another drought year with smaller canopies and a lighter than normal crop. The growing season stayed warm throughout the summer and into the beginning of fall, resulting in an early harvest for Chardonnay. The resulting wines possess beautiful concentration and depth of flavors that are reflective of these amazing blocks and their respective terroir.

FERMENTATION & AGING

The grapes were handpicked at night and arrived at the winery before the sunrise to ensure that fruit purity, aromatics and freshness were retained. Both blocks were 100% whole cluster pressed on a very gentle fourhour cycle. The juice was immediately racked to French Oak barrels where both native primary and malolactic fermentation took place for over 24 weeks. Each individual barrel was sur lie aged and kept separate until the final selections were ultimately determined.

WINEMAKER IMPRESSIONS

The 2020 Odette Reserve Chardonnay was 100% barrel fermented with indigenous yeast in 70% new French Oak and sur lie aged for 16 months. The long, drawn-out fermentation, also known as the "death and resurrection", adds depth and nuances that complement the concentrated and layered palate. Offering notes of Brioche, white peach, lemon curd, roasted nuts, with hints of salinity and wet stone, this "old shot Wente" selection carries a sense of purity, elegance and class that can be enjoyed both near and long term.

In 2018, we flagged 25 different picks across the Estate over a 20 day span.

FERMENTATION & AGING

Fermentation took place in fully jacketed stainless steel fermenters after a four day cold soak at 55 degrees Fahrenheit. Macerations lasted 8-14 days at a maximum temperature of 94 degrees Fahrenheit. Malolactic fermentation took place in barrel and finished up in late winter. Each barrel was selected for the final blend in the spring of 2020. The wine was aged in 75% new French Oak barrels and 25% used French Oak barrels for 20 months prior to bottling.

WINEMAKER IMPRESSIONS

The 2018 Odette Estate Cabernet Sauvignon, Stags Leap District is full bodied and opaque black in color, revealing bing cherries, raspberries, blueberries, pencil lead shavings, tobacco, dried herbs, and crushed granite. It's tightly knit core, very fine tannins and firm structure lead way to the long and persistent finish. Enjoy over the next 15+ years.

Fermentation took place in fully jacketed stainless steel fermenters after a four day cold soak at 55 degrees Fahrenheit. Macerations lasted 8-14 days at a maximum temperature of 94 degrees Fahrenheit. Malolactic fermentation took place in barrel and finished up in late winter. Each barrel was hand selected for the final blend in the spring of 2020. Only three out of the initial 25 lots were chosen, with only 18 barrels total amongst that group. The wine was aged in 100% new French Oak barrels for 22 months prior to bottling.

WINEMAKER IMPRESSIONS

The 2018 Odette Reserve Cabernet Sauvignon, Stags Leap District is full-bodied, multi-dimensional and seamless, with beautifully integrated silky tannins and a commanding presence. Carrying notes of black currants, blackberry preserves, fresh blueberries, hints of lilacs, pencil lead shavings, scorched earth and tobacco. This expressive, vibrant, structured and layered Cabernet Sauvignon, is built for the long haul yet irresistible now. Enjoy over the next 20+ years.
